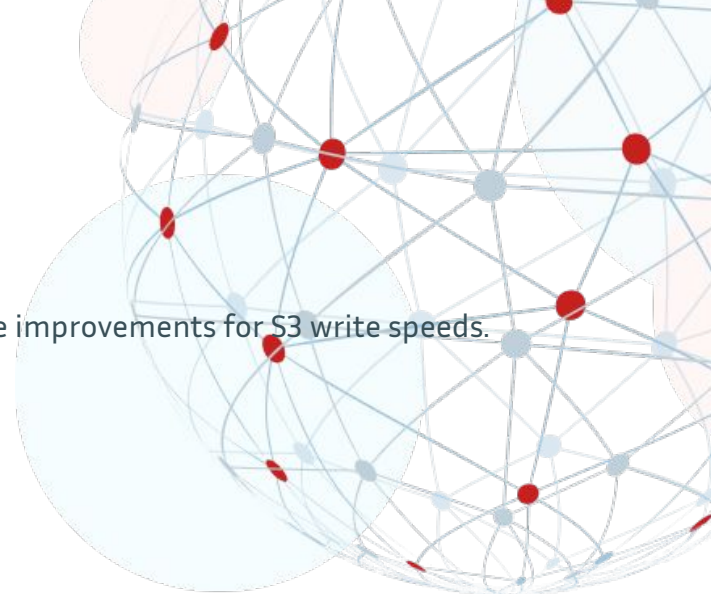
Current Work
