

What is Fedora?

Fedora is a sustainable open-source repository system underpinning many types of digital libraries and archives. It's designed to store, manage, and preserve digital content.

Fedora is particularly well-suited for institutions such as libraries, universities, research centres, and museums that need to preserve and provide access to their digital collections.

- Stores, preserves, and provides access to digital objects
- Supports flexible content models for objects
- Supports semantic relationships between objects
- Native fixity checking
- Interoperates with other applications and services
- Published RESTful API



Why Use Fedora?

- Flexibility: It can handle both simple & complex use cases
- Content is durable: Fedora supports long-term preservation
- Standards-based
- Thriving global community support

A simple, non-proprietary, specified, open-standards approach to the layout of preservation persistence.







Current Work - Fedora 7.x is Coming!

Fedora Dependency Upgrade Project - Now Complete 🔽



Phase 1 - Code Coverage Review (March - May)

Increased code coverage to 80% across core codebase and improved integration tests

- Phase 2 Dependency Upgrades (May August)
 Completed upgrades to over 40 dependency libraries
 Major upgrades include Java 11 → 21 which also included the Java to Jakarta namespace change

Phase 3 - Community Testing

Will be seeking community input on testing of Fedora 7.x

Fedora 7.x Release Timeline

- Now Late Fall
 - The technical and committer teams will be wrapping up a few hanging feature requests to include in the new release.
 - Alpha release for internal testing.
- Late Fall Year End
 - Public Beta release and community testing phase
- Early 2026
 - Release Candidate and additional community testing
 - Official release of Fedora 7.x



What Does This Mean for Users?

Already on Fedora 6.x? No problem. There is NO MIGRATION REQUIRED.

On an older version? ALL existing community migration tools will also function to bring you to 7.x.


Up Next

Resolving Outstanding Transactions Issues

- Several community members have reported issues with long/lagging transaction commit times or transaction failures with large transactions
- Related Tickets: <u>FCREPO-4027</u>

Other Hanging Features/Bugs

- HTML UI Addition of a "confirmation" step for Delete function
- Apache 5 & JSON LD Update to support compaction/expansion/flattening

- Plans to host more workshops in early 2026


Future Development Plans
