Dear Mr. Broda,

Thank you very much for your letter of 4th May. To begin with: I shall be very glad and proud if you will include me in the sponsors of the proposed meeting in autumn. I hope I shall be able to attend it.

I have just finished a letter to
Mr. Ullrich, including an article in
German on "Österreichische Wissenschaft"
for the same issue of the Kulturelle
Schriftenreihe inwhich you will write
on Boltzmannn. If you can get a proof of
this article, you will see that my idea
is: Austrians ought not to cackle too
much about their contribution to Wissenschaft. Nobody can overlook it anyhow.
By cackling they 'll only create the impression that Austrian Science needs advertizing - which it does not. Could you
imagine a Dutchman doing the same for his
country? (Which, pro rata, has certainly



produced about 5 or 10 times as much as the U.S.A.)

I mean to say, that we Austrians too must remember that we are a great Kultur nation in spite of the smallness of our country; and that, if we advertise phree, ourselves, we must do it with great restraint and reserve and selfconsciousness.

On re-reading the preceding lines, which I wrote yesterday evening, I find I have not well expressed what I meant, but you will understand me approximately and I do not want to waste time by tearing the letter up and writing another one.

Allow me to add a suggestion, viz. to include J.B.S. Haldane in the British scientists to be approached in the matter Of those which you mentioned I know Blackett best, indeed I love him as a dead dear friend. He is sure to give us any support he can.
